The first Barcamp Cameroon was held November 7, 2009 at the Hotel Meridien Douala, under the theme "Digital Dreams". On June 12 2010, it is hotel Djeuga Palace in Yaounde who had the honor of hosting the Barcamp Cameroon second edition. "This is our land" theme was found to allow IT people of Cameroon to reaffirm their origin and the debate to channel development. In 2011, AppsTech Douala took over for the third edition called "The Future is Mobile". In practical terms, the first three editions, was attended by nearly 300 people.

This year's Barcamp Cameroon 2012 re-designed the future of Cameroon and Africa with a big homecoming. "Valuing Our Culture with ICT "was the motto of the 4th edition with 450 people participating at the Goethe Institut in Yaoundé last May 19.

Each Barcamp Cameroon edition includes an introductory and a closing presentation rooms allongside parallel workshops. Each workshop is coordinated by a moderator whose mission is to manage the list of topics proposed by the community prior to the event. The presentation of each project should take 3 to 5 minutes. The Coordinator can then discuss openly for 10 minutes.

The name "BarCamp" refers to its origins, with reference to a hacker slang term, foobar. The first BarCamp was held in Palo Alto, California, August 25 to 27, 2005, in the offices of the Socialtext society. It was organized in less than a week from it's inception, with nearly 200 participants. Since then, Barcamps were organized in the United States, Europe, Asia and Africa.

The BarCamp is organized primarily through the web, using what might be called the communication tools of the Web 2.0. Specifically, BarCamps depend also on the goodwill of organizers, the generosity of sponsors. This volunteering goes through loans, premises and providing a reliable internet connection, to the drinks and meal.

All participants are encouraged to submit a project or help during an intervention. To prepare and enable Barcamp to evolve, it is advisable to register in advance which topics we would like to discuss the Barcamp wiki page. Everyone can initiate a BarCamp, using the BarCamp wiki or creating its own branch.
